Museveni emphasized that despite challenges posed by the loss of historical combat commanders, the UPDF/NRA/Fronasa sustained its mission of liberating Uganda. However, he pointed out ongoing issues such as corruption and insufficient training that have impacted the army.

"The tragic incident where 57 soldiers were lost in Somalia was attributed to corruption," Museveni said. "Despite these challenges, the majority of the army remains dedicated and clean."

Museveni commended the current Chief of Defence Forces (CDF), Gen. Muhoozi Kaneirugaba, for addressing the issue of misuse of resources by reallocating funds to build barracks and improve soldiers' welfare.


